Definitions

| Invasive Species | A species (plant or animal) that has been introduced to an area where it does not naturally occur, AND causes harm to the environment, the economy, and/or human health. |

| Native Species | A species (plant or animal) that remains in a habitat or ecosystem where it has evolved and adapted. |
| Deciduous | A plant that drops its leaves in the winter. |
| Coniferous | A plant that does NOT drop its leaves in the winter. |
| Diverse Plant Community | For the purposes of this BINGO game is an area where at least 3 different types of plants exist. Plant types: ferns, grasses, shrubs, coniferous trees, deciduous trees |
| Riparian Area | The area of land around a body of water (stream, river, creek, lake, etc.). The health of the riparian |
| Wetland | An area of land that is wet for at least part of the year, has soil that is low in oxygen and is dominated by water-loving plants |
| Scat | Animal droppings |
